GOLD STAR FAMILY MEMORIAL MONUMENT

The material that the Gold Star Families Memorial Monument is constructed from may be black marble or black granite; however, research indicates that granite has a longer endurance than marble. The GSF Memorial Monument is not registered with any agency; and the original contractors/architects (Architect letter pg. 5) are happy to answer any question or address any concerns. It is suggested that a plaque (bronze or granite) (18" x 16" atop a 4" x 4" post) be placed near or adjacent to the GSF Memorial Monument giving an explanation of the message and meaning of the scenes of the monument to insure an understanding of each of the panels of the memorial monument. Information, design, and presentation drawings as well as a letter from the architect and planner are included in this package.

Many communities/cities have Honorary Board Members from our foundation and will be happy to assist anyone interested in this project.


THE FIRST SCENE DEPICTS THEIR HOMELAND: THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Re: Gold Star Families Monument

Dear Mr. Williams

It would be an honor to have the Gold Star Families Monument erected at locations beyond the DKMSVC in Institute, WV.

The time invested in the design and the presentation drawings, including the color images and videos were never billed to anyone. I performed this work gratis in an effort to express my respect to you, my appreciation for the members of the U.S. military who dedicated themselves to protecting the country we love, and especially my gratitude to the families of fallen soldiers for the sacrifices they will forever endure, and to whom adequate honor can never be fully paid.

Blackwood Associates, Inc. has no desire to profit from the construction of this Monument. Please understand there were costs associated with the construction of the Monument that were part of the overall construction of the Cemetery in Institute, WV. Some costs will likely be required if the Monument is constructed at other locations. Mainly the foundation design: this could vary at other locations due to soil conditions and construction methods. We would strongly recommend that the soil conditions at prospective Monument sites, and the adequacy of the foundation system, be reviewed and approved by a qualified geotechnical engineer. (The granite slabs and base are nearly 4 tons! We don't want it to sink or settle unevenly.) Another important consideration for the Monument is the orientation, relative to the sun.

Regarding the images used for the laser etchings, specifically the iconic photograph of the Marines Raising the Flag on two Jima taken by Joe Rosenthal / The Associated Press. I have done some research but not been able to determine if written permission is required for using the photo as a *reference* for artwork. We are not re-printing the photo nor using it for profit. This image has been used on many WWII and Marine Monuments around the country. I'm not sure if you have any insight regarding this.

I give you, Hershel Williams, permission to use the Gold Star Families Monument design, originally intended to the be constructed at the Donel C. Kinnard Memorial State Veterans Cemetery in Institute, West Virginia, for construction at other locations, with the following caveats;

- I, Kenton Blackwood, be recognized as the designer of the Monument, and for the following inscription be placed in small letters in a non-descript location of the monument: "Designed by Blackwood Associates, Inc." (example attached)
- 2. I, Kenton Blackwood, and Blackwood Associates, Inc. of Fairmont, West Virginia shall be held harmless and free of any liability for the design and construction.






ELEVATION 2






